

## MINUTES

March 16, 2010 Meeting

1. Call to Order. Jack Warman called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.
2. Meeting Minutes. Following a motion by Jack and second by Dan, the February 16 meeting minutes were approved unanimously.
3. Adjustments to the Agenda. None.
4. Announcements. None.
5. Public Comment. None.
6. Development Review Committee Report. Dan Clever said the committee discussed the following at its last meeting: recent Duke site plans and the Duke Sidewalk Master Plan; the proposed modifications to the Riddle / Fayetteville / Buxton intersection; proposed UDO amendments; the trail connection between Southpoint Mall and the ATT Phase E; and the site plan for the NC 55-TW Alexander development. Jack thanked Dale for his work to incorporate a pedestrian connection along TW Alexander Drive into the NC 55 / TW Alexander site plan.
7. Bike Plan Implementation Committee Report. Scott reported that at its last meeting the committee reviewed the draft Durham bike map and discussed the need to submit data from the final map to Google. The committee recommends placing sharrows on Blackwell-Corcoran-Foster as the top priority for sharrows. The committee also discussed the resolution adopted by Cary and Chatham County leaders requesting safety improvements to the American Tobacco Trail crossings in Chatham County. Scott briefly discussed the meeting of the Woodcroft HOA on the

- Third Fork Creek Trail and reported the trail is under construction and will be opened in stages as sections are completed. Scott asked Dale about the status of restriping bicycle lanes on Revere Road following resurfacing.
8. Pedestrian Plan Implementation Committee Report. Greg reviewed the committee's written report (attached). Greg thanked BPAC members for positively representing BPAC in meetings with elected officials. Greg said he is adding 2009 pedestrian crashes to the Google map.
  9. Communications Committee. Ken reviewed the committee's report (attached). He noted that the committee has a new member, Jessalee Landfried. He also discussed staffing a booth at the Farmer's Market this year. Ken reviewed the committee's plans for planning upcoming Earth Day and Bike to Work Week activities.
  10. ATT Phase E. Dan Clever provided an update on ATT Phase E.
  11. Anderson Street Update. Dale McKeel reported that Anderson Street resurfacing and restriping for bike lanes is underway.
  12. Durham Bike Map. Dale reported that the kick-off meeting for the Durham Bike Map was on February 24. Dan and Scott will be BPAC's representatives to the bike map committee. The consultant has gotten good feedback on the map and another meeting will be scheduled in late March or early April.
  13. Bicycle Friendly Community Application. Dale said the application deadline is July 16.
  14. Garneau Report Task Force. Erik discussed the work of the committee and BPAC members. He said there had been press coverage in the Herald-Sun and Bull City Rising. He said the next steps would be to review "lessons learned" from the press release and the meetings with staff and elected officials, and to review the pedestrian priority lists that Dale is updating.
  15. Video. Alan screened his "Green in 3" video submitted to the Duke School of the Environment. The bloopers video is forthcoming.
